## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Spring 2014 headcount increased 8.8% and the FTE increased 4.3%. Full-time headcount was up 37 students and part-time headcount was up 25 students resulting in a total increase of 62 students. The number of students who attended EWC for the first time in Spring 2014 was down 3 full-time students and down 9 part-time students. The number of students who had attended EWC anytime prior to Spring 2014 was up 40 full-time students and up 34 part-time students. Goshen County was up 34 full-time students and up 14 part-time students, and Outreach increased by 3 full-time students and increased by 13 part-time students. Goshen County FTE increased by 49.42 FTE, and Outreach decreased by 0.23 FTE. Outreach accounted for 39.8% and Goshen County accounted for 60.2% of the FTE.

Credit course offerings are provided as regular courses in both Goshen County and most of the 12 outreach sites. In addition, concurrent enrollment in the high schools, and distance learning courses are also offered. Goshen County courses generated 719.04 FTE of which 6.8% were from concurrent enrollment courses, 8.2% from evening courses, and 19.3% from distance education courses. Concurrent enrollment courses generated 52.8% of the 475.76 FTE from Outreach.

The 153 distance education courses served 190 students living in EWC's outreach areas and 193 students living in Goshen County for a total of 383 students. However, 150 (77.7%) of the 193 students in Goshen County were also enrolled in regular on-campus day courses. Similarly, the 21 on-campus credit evening courses served a total of 350 students with 167 (47.7%) of the students also enrolled in regular on-campus day courses. Distance education courses meet the needs of busy working adults and also regular on-campus students.

Developmental courses are offered for those students who do not have college level skills in reading, writing, and mathematics. There were 178 students enrolled in developmental courses, which accounted for 5.3% of the FTE. Of the 178 students enrolled in developmental courses, 114 of those students are seeking an associate degree or certificate.

The total Spring 2014 headcount was 1,842 students. Of those students, 1171 (63.6%) were non-degree seeking. High School students accounted for 688 (58.8%) students of the 1171 non-degree seeking students. The programs with the largest enrollments were Interdisciplinary Studies, Welding & Joining Technology, and Veterinary Technology.

Eastern Wyoming College provides numerous non-credit and workforce development offerings. EWC's non-credit enrollment was 2,594 students compared to 2,129 students in Spring 2013. EWC's workforce development efforts provided 68 credit courses totaling 123.16 FTE and 24 non-credit courses meeting for a total of 531.00 contact hours to provide further educational opportunities for individuals in or preparing to enter the workforce.

The Spring 2014 on-campus, full-time students came from 18 states and one foreign country. Most of the students came from five states: Wyoming, Nebraska, Colorado, South Dakota, and Montana. Within Wyoming, the full-time, on-campus students came from all 23 counties, with the majority coming from Goshen, Converse, and Laramie. The gender distribution for all credit students was 44% male and 56% female. The ethnicity distribution was 88% white non-Hispanic, 8% Hispanic, and 4% all others. The average age of students enrolled in credit courses was 27.4 with a 23.1 average for full-time students and a 29.4 average for part-time students.

## EWC FINAL ENROLLMENT SPRING 2014

EWC experienced an 8.8% increase in total student headcount as compared to Spring 2013. The total student headcount of 1842 students reflects an overall increase of 62 students. Total full-time enrollment was up 37 students and total part-time enrollment was up 25 students compared to Spring 2013. Spring 2014 enrollment was 78.2 students above the five-year average.

EWC experienced an increase of 4.3% in FTE compared to Spring 2013. The FTE is 61.4 above the 5 year average.

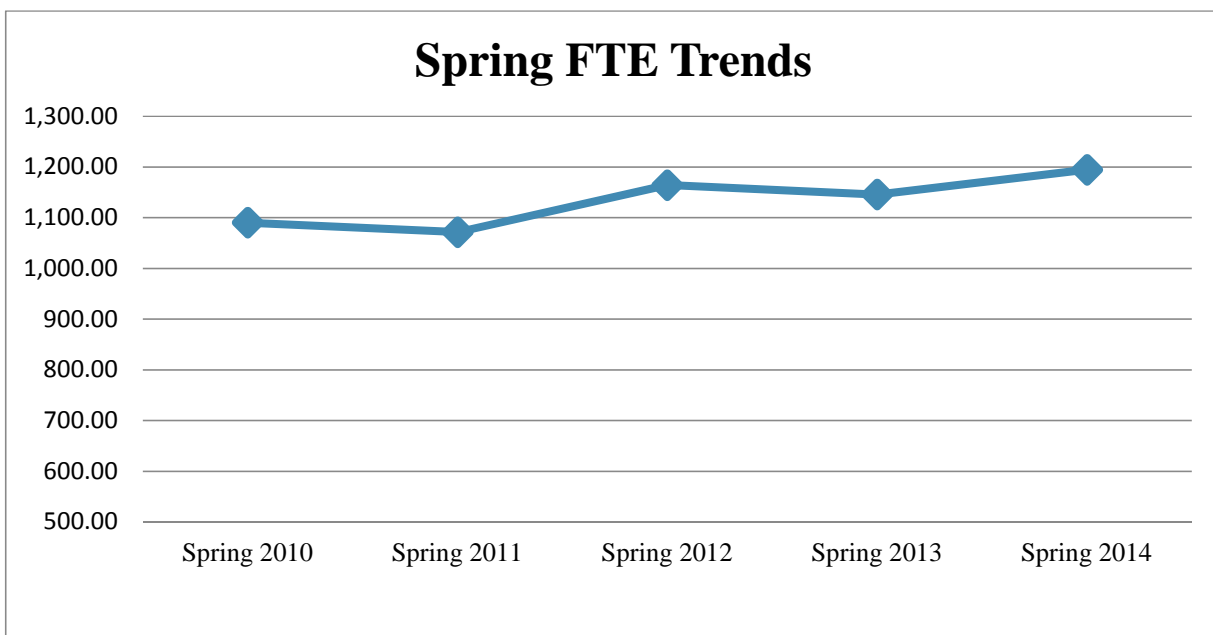
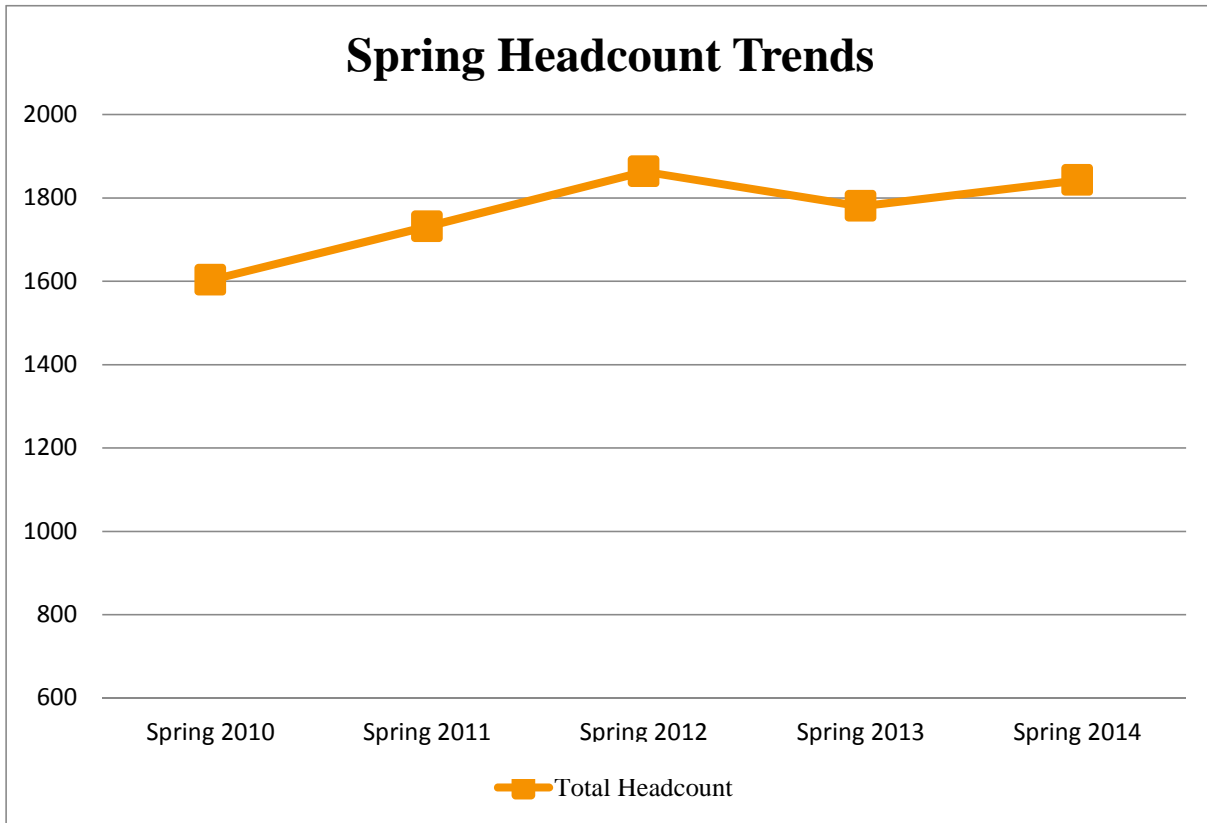

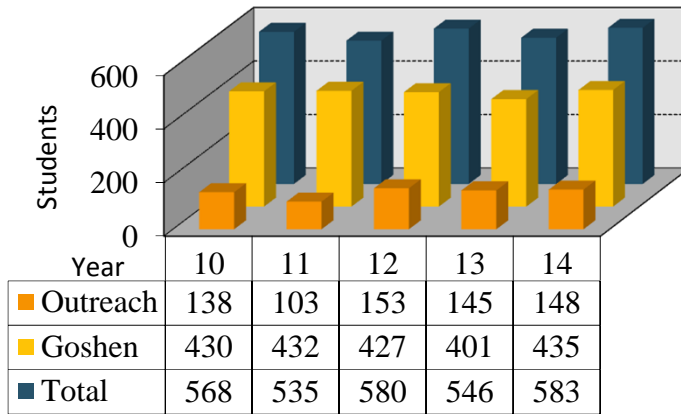
## SPRING FULL-TIME HEADCOUNT

EWC experienced an increase of 3 (2.1%) full-time students in Outreach enrollment and an increase of 34 (8.5%) students in Goshen County for a total increase of 37 (6.8%) students as compared to Spring 2013. Outreach full-time headcount was 11 students above the five-year average. Goshen County was 10 students above the five-year average for an overall 21 students above the five-year average.

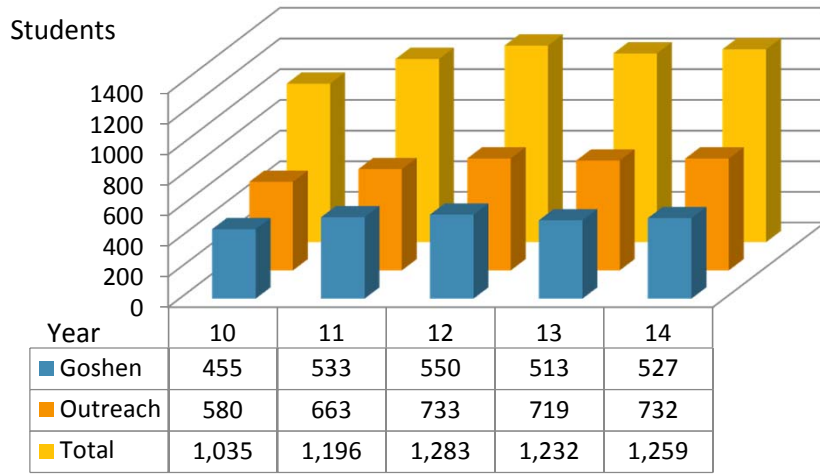
### SPRING PART-TIME HEADCOUNT

EWC experienced an increase of 13 (1.8%) part-time students in Outreach enrollment and an increase of 14 (2.7%) students in Goshen County for a total increase of 27 (2.2%) students as compared to Spring 2013. Spring 2013 outreach part-time headcount was 47 students above the five-year average, and Goshen County part-time headcount was 11 students above the five-year average. The total part-time headcount was above the five-year average by 58 students.

### SPRING HEADCOUNT BY AGE

The two highest enrollments by age group were the 17-24 age group with 55.2% of the enrollment and 16 or Younger with 11.9%. The most significant changes were an increase of 69 students in the 17-24 age group and a decrease of 37 students in the 25-29 age group. The traditional age students (24 and younger) had an increase of 122 students. The non-traditional age students (25 and older) had a decrease of 54 students.

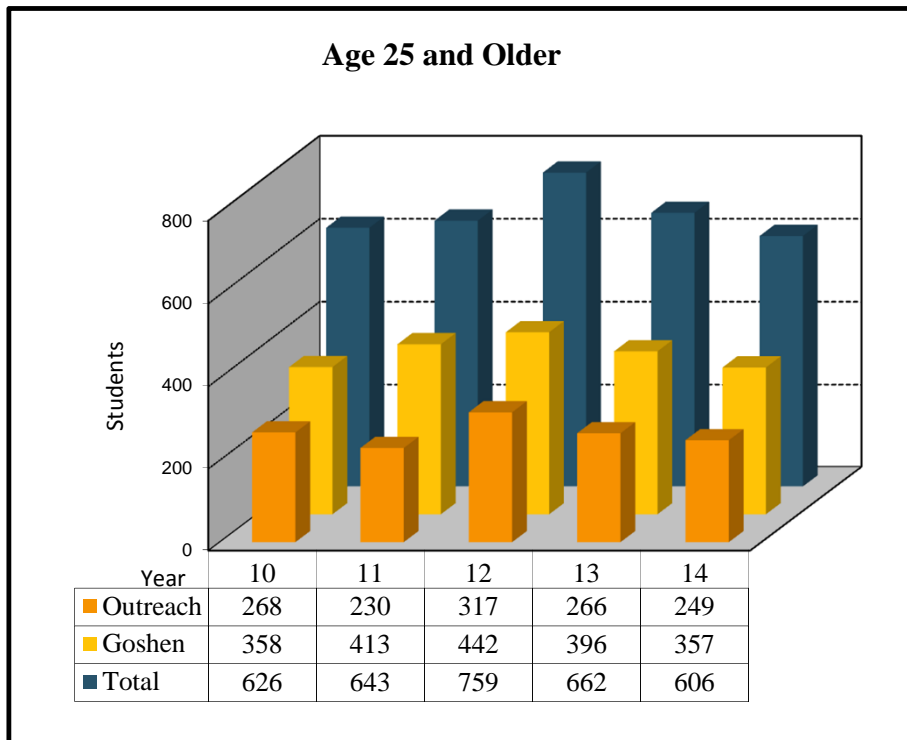
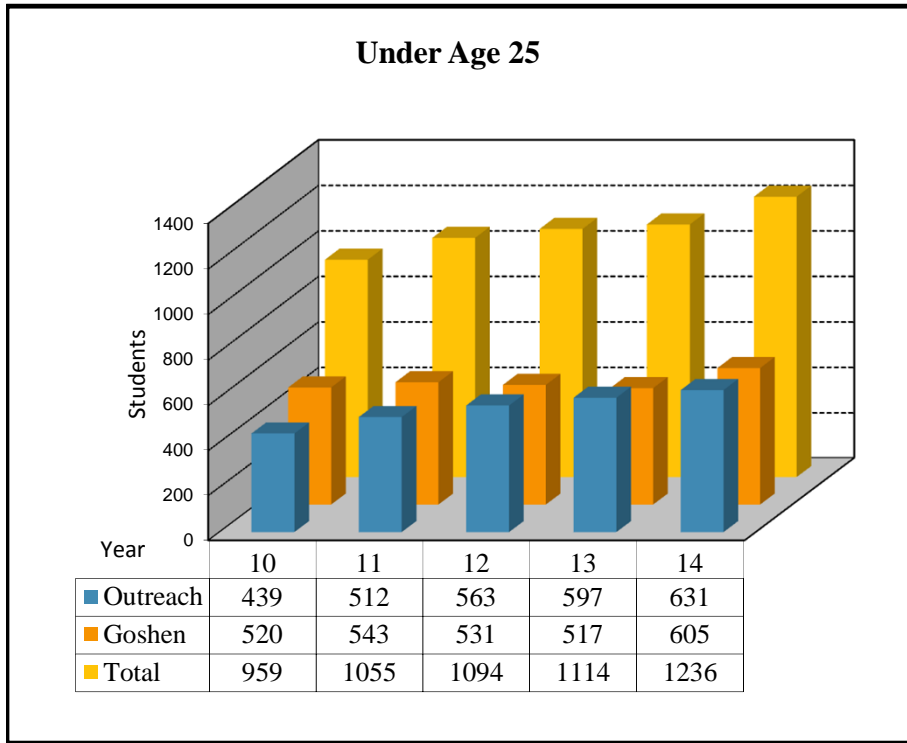

## SPRING AGE UNDER 25/AGE 25 AND OLDER



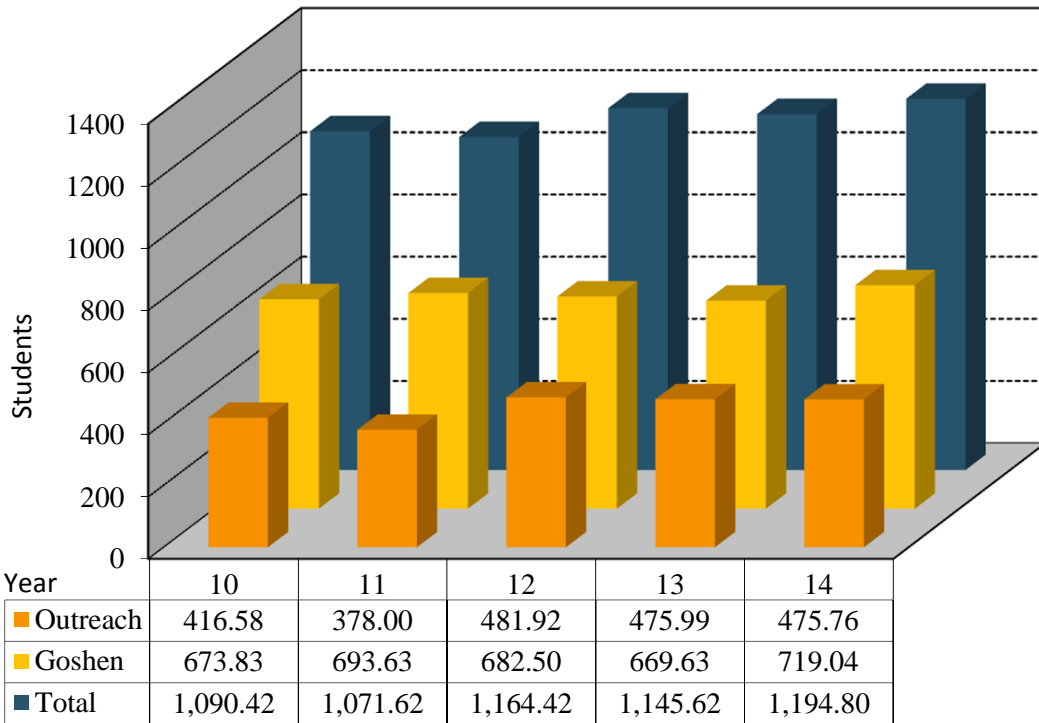
### SPRING FTE BY LOCATION

EWC experienced an increase of 49.2 (4.3%) FTE compared to Spring 2013. Goshen County had an increase of 49.4 (7.4%) FTE. Outreach had a decrease of 0.2 (0.0%) FTE. **The total FTE distribution was 39.8% Outreach and 60.2% Goshen County.** Goshen County FTE was above the five-year average by 31.3. Outreach was above their five-year average by 30.1. The total FTE is 61.4 above the five-year.

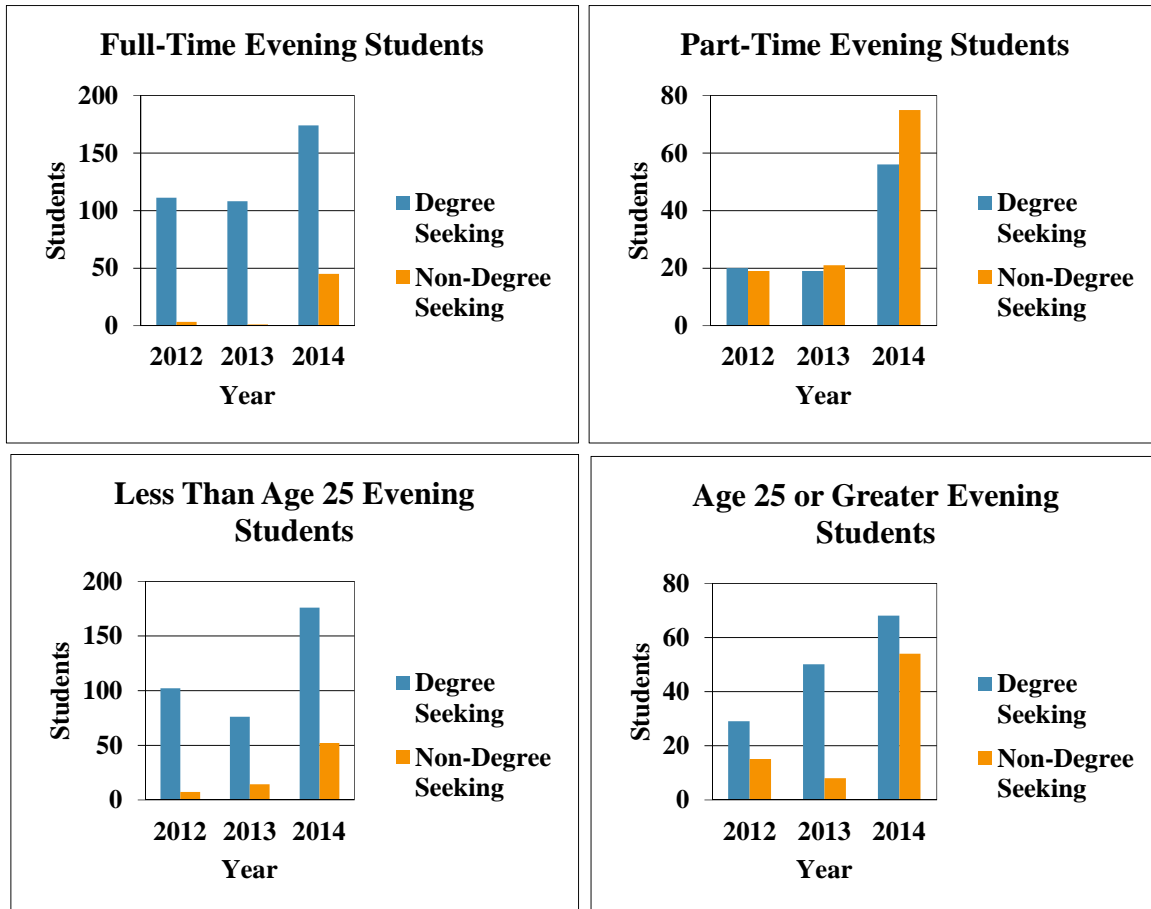

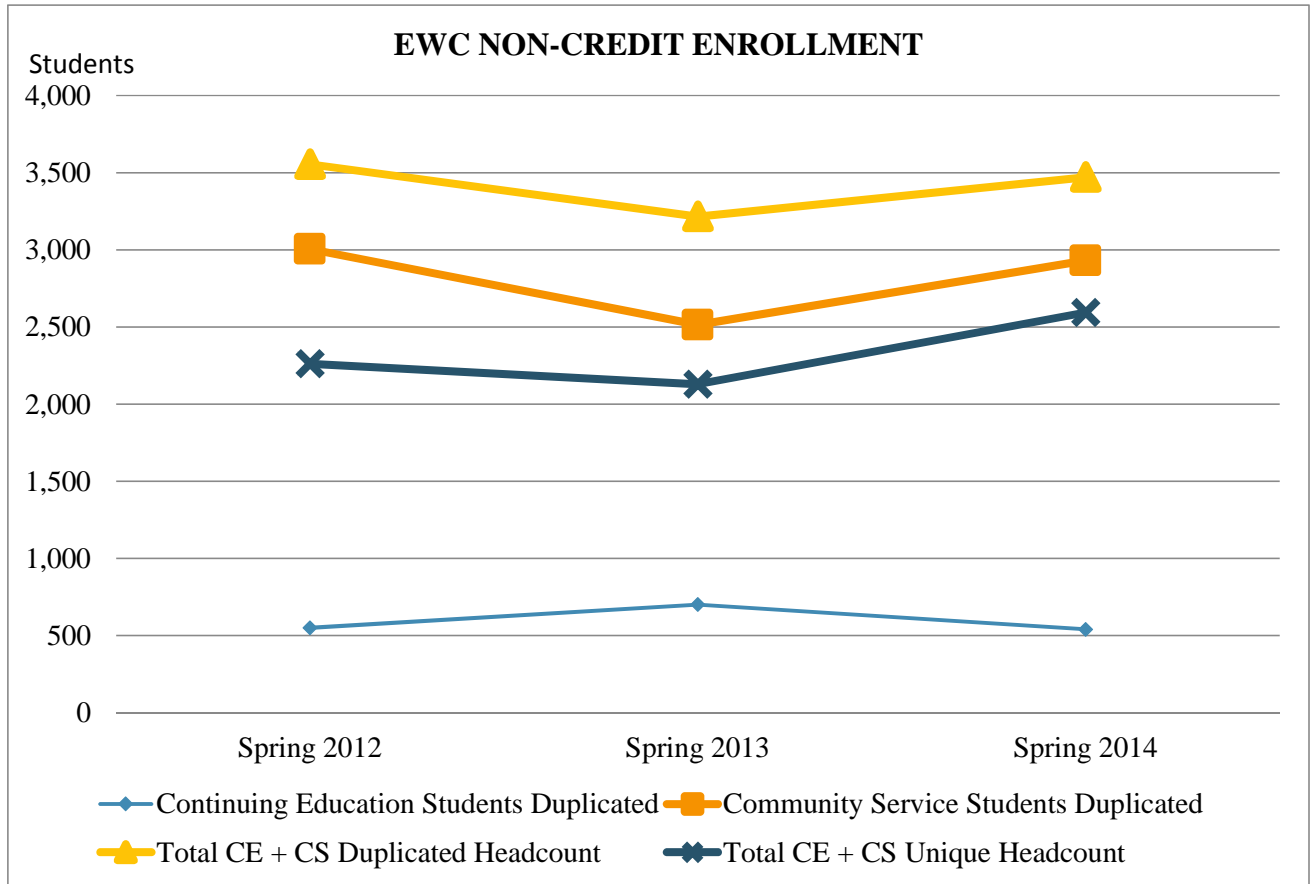

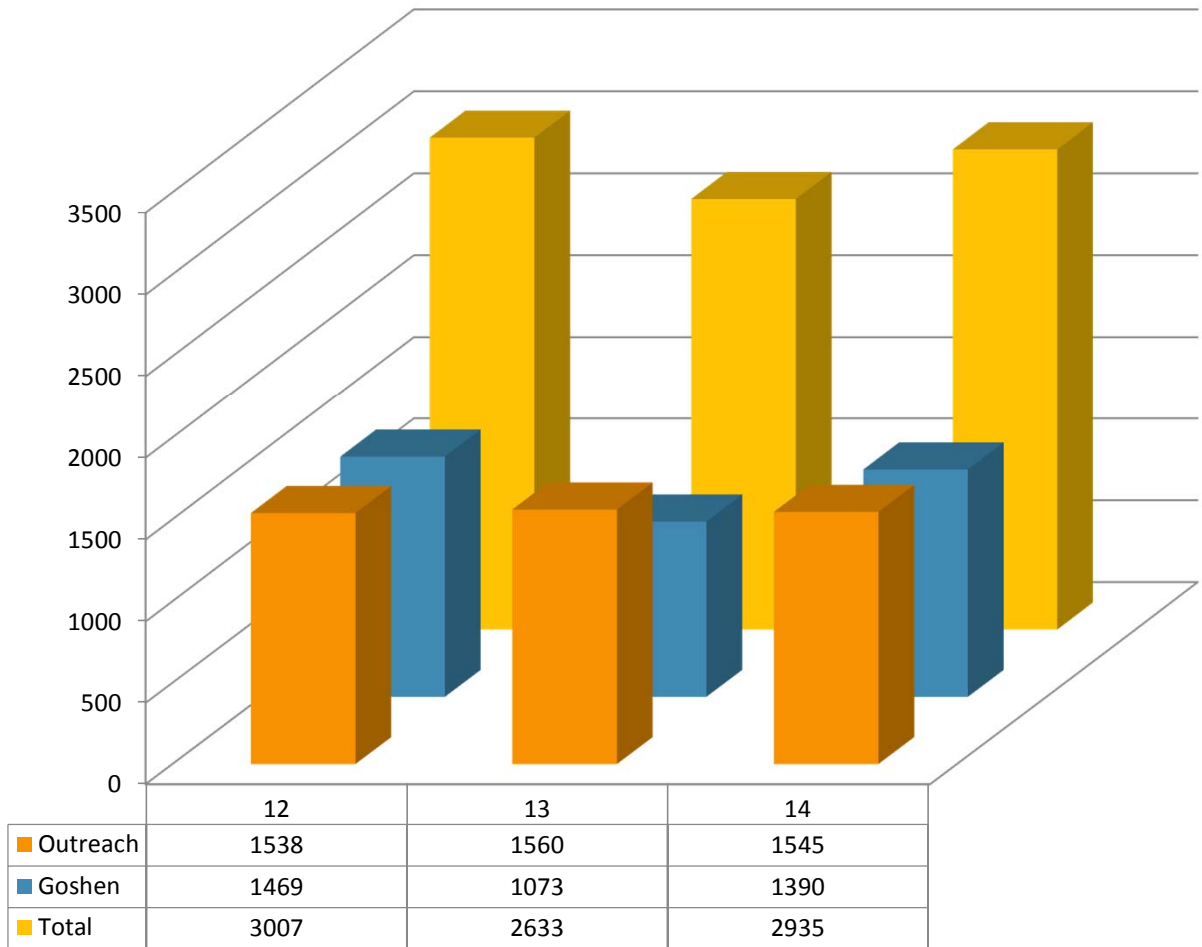

## WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

### Credit Courses

Compared to Spring 2013 EWC's workforce development offerings for college credit decreased by 15 course sections. The duplicated student headcount decreased by 175 (22.5%) students, and the FTE decreased by 21.36 (14.8%) FTE.

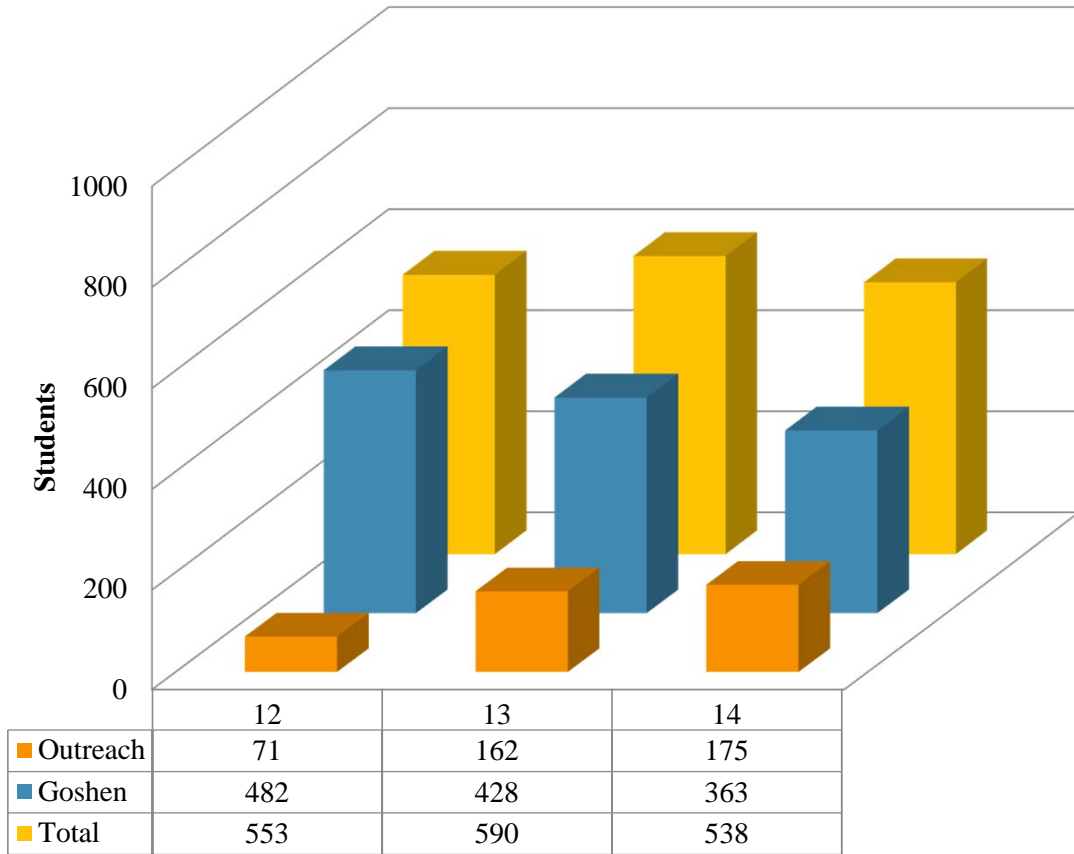
